- educate resource crews on potentially dangerous wildlife avoidance and safety measures.
- assess work sites for the presence of potentially dangerous wildlife.
- take remedial actions to avoid negative wildlife interactions.
- provide immediate intervention to protect crews from dangerous wildlife.
